





Background

- In 1988, Gerry moved to Swarthmore, Pennsylvania, where he practices from offices in his home and in Media (county seat of Delaware County). He does patent and trademark prosecution and counseling, intellectual property litigation, Internet law counseling including IP audits, and expert witnessing on patent and trade regulation matters.
